Aylsham	Aylsham	1849	Became St Michaels hospital now being converted into flats
Docking	Docking	1835	Now residential
Downham Market	Downham	1836	'Howdale Home'. Demolished 1968
Gayton	Freebridge Lynn	1838	'Eastgate House'. Now private house
Great Snoring	Walsingham	1836	Chapel and some walls survive
Great Yarmouth	Yarmouth	1838	Now Northgate Hospital
Gressenhall	Mitford and Launditch	1775	'Beech House'. Now Gressenhall Farm and Workhouse museum
Heckingham	Loddon and Clavering	1765	Became Hales Hospital now empty
Horsham St Faiths	St Faiths	1805	Demolished 1930
Kenninghall	Guiltcross	1836	Main building demolished 1930. Hospital block surviving
Kings Lynn	Kings Lynn	1854	Now St James hospital
Lingwood	Blofield	1837	'Homelea'. Demolished – sheltered home complex on site
Norwich	Norwich	1859	'Woodlands Hospital, West Norwich Hospital. Main building Demolished 1959 – site now Community Hospital.
Pulham Market	Depwade	1836	'Hill House Hospital'. Now residential.
Rockland all Saints	Wayland	1836	Closed 1912. Demolished
Rollesby	East and West Flegg	1775	Part now private house
Smallburgh	Tunstead and Happing	1785	Small number of walls and out buildings survive
Swaffham	Swaffham	1836	Only Hospital block and burial ground survive
Swainsthorpe	Henstead	1836	'Vale Hospital. Now residential
Thetford	Thetford	1836	'St Barnabas Hospital'. Demolished 1978 site now sheltered home complex
West Beckham	Erpingham	1848	main building demolished 1970s. Hospital block survives
Wicklewood	Forehoe	1776	'Hill House Hospital'. 1974 St Georges school. Now residential.

Eye	Hartismere and Hoxne	1915	Infirmery now 'Hartismere Hospital'.
Ipswich	Ipswich	1836	Great Wig Street
Ipswich	Ipswich	1898	Woodbridge road. Site Ipswich General Hospital. Main building demolished
Kedington	Risbridge	1855	Now housing and geriatric care home on site
Mildenhall	Mildenhall	pre 1834	Ex parish workhouse
Mildenhall	Mildenhall	1895	Kings Way. Demolished
Nacton	Woodbridge	1756	Closed 1900
Onehouse	Stow	1778	Became stow Lodge Hospital. Now residential
Oulton	Mutford and Lothingland	1765	'Lothingland Hospital'. Demolished 1960s
Semer	Cosford	1781	Isolation Hospital now private house
Shipmeadow	Wangford	1765	Now residential
Stradbroke	Hoxne	1835	Closed 1871. Fever Block now residential
Sudbury	Sudbury	1836	'Walnut Tree Hospital'.
Tattingstone	Samford	1765	'St Mary's Hospital'. Closed 1991. Now residential
Wickham Market	Plomesgate	1836	Now residential
