Children discover what it was like to live in Norfolk one hundred years ago through this hands-on event. They work with costumed characters in atmospheric historical settings and handle museum objects.

The Vicar is coming to tea and your children are invited to help make everything spick and span. They lend a hand with the cooking and make the tea in Cherry Tree Cottage, scrub and mangle their way through old-fashioned washing in the Washhouse and find out about life in the Farmhouse through an active object handling session.

Aims and learning outcomes

Early Years Foundation Stage

- Understanding the world. Explore different environments and talk about past and present events.
- Communication and language. Interacting with museum educators promotes listening and attention, understanding and speaking.
- Personal, social and emotional development. Help develop self-confidence and self-awareness.

KS1 History

- Identify similarities and differences between ways of life in the recent past and today.
- Discover different ways to find about the past: get hands-on with objects and explore historic buildings.
- Explore a significant place in the locality.
- Speaking, questioning and listening skills including broadening historical vocabulary.
