Hunter Gatherer or First Farmer? Pupils explore life 5000 years ago using our fantastic Neolithic collections and wonderful site. They hunt for animals in the woods, get to grips with Neolithic tools, plough a field using the ard plough and make a Neolithic shelter.

### Aims and learning outcomes

#### KS2 History

- Changes in Britain from the Stone Age: an active and in-depth exploration of the lives of hunter-gatherers and impact of the first farmers.
- Learn from important sources of evidence: get hands-on with objects.
- Develop listening, speaking and questioning skills.
